

Lights for the Ukraine-

Some of you have been asking about the lights for the Ukraine Project.

Dave Nonnemacher will speak on the evening of March 6, and then we will have the opportunity to assemble the lights to be sent to the Ukraine.

In March 2023, Dave Nonnemacher (New Horizons – USA – Romania) returned from the border of Moldova and Ukraine, having brought 10 of the solar light kits to be tested to verify functionality in the area, and then sent out to be put into use.

Each unit, once charged by 8 hours of sunlight, can provide 10+ hours of light for one room or a dim nightlight for a week. They also have the very important ability to slowly charge a cell phone. Currently in the Ukraine there are only about 2 hours of power sources available per day in communities with some infrastructure intact, nothing for rural areas.

Assembling these light kits is personal, tangible way of giving graciously to the Ukrainian people.

If you are interested in helping assemble the lights, please sign up in the fellowship hall by February 18, so we have enough light kits on hand. If you are interested in contributing financially, please contact a deacon.

Favorite Memories:

Raeleigh: During the Mbuguni clinic outreach day, another team member and I were in charge of giving out glasses to the Maasai people, a local tribe. While reading one lady's reasons for why she needed glasses, she wrote "to read the Bible." It was impactful to me to be the reason one person can have a deeper and closer relationship with the Lord. Another favorite memory was the second outreach day in Arusha. During this day I got to deliver a baby. While delivering the baby, I had an overwhelming feeling of calling. I've always known I wanted to be a mom and have a family, but this moment just set in stone for me the calling God has bestowed upon me. Shayla and I (the other girl from our group also in the delivery room) started crying during the delivery from the coolness of bringing a child into the world. Both Rae and Lucy's favorite day was visiting the village of lepers. We both were amazed by God's wonders. While meeting these amazing people, we had an overwhelming feeling of being the hands and feet of Jesus. In the Bible, Jesus interacted many times with lepers. In this moment we felt extremely close to Jesus as we were participating in something He did many years ago.

Lucy: A special memory to me from the trip was going to a Maasai tribe's Christian church service on the first Sunday afternoon we were there. They let us participate in the worship of the Lord with them. They taught us how they sing and dance to give glory to God and expressively celebrate His majesty. It was powerful to hear their joyful voices in a new language that I couldn't understand, but I knew God could. I was in awe of God's infinite creativity in culture and language. I am a minuscule fraction of this world, and I experienced a glimpse of heaven when I was part of a larger group of saints who worship God from every tribe, tongue, and nation. Upon arriving in Tanzania, I was distraught at the brokenness and poverty I was encountering that first Saturday. I found myself asking God where He was in this place. But that next day, He woke me up and put it right in front of me, and for the rest of the trip, I was keenly aware of God's presence everywhere I went.
