In Memory - Otto A. Huizenga

Mr. Otto Huizenga, age 91, of Orange City, passed away on Sunday, December 29, 2024, at the Prairie Ridge Care Center in Orange City.

The memorial service was on Thursday, January 2. Rev. Stephen Terpstra and the Rev. Jordan Helming officiated.

Otto Alvin was born on April 21, 1933, in Orange City, the son of Tony and Rena (Jasper) Huizenga. He was raised in Orange City and attended the Orange City Christian School. In 1955, he enlisted in the United States Army and was stationed at Camp Chaffy Arkansas and Fort Lewis Washington. He was honorably discharged in 1957 and returned to Orange City.

On May 8, 1957, he was united in marriage to Madelyne Statema in Ireton. They made their home in Orange City, where in earlier years, Otto was employed by Pals Transfer and Northwest REC. They then operated O & M Grocery Stores in Orange City and Maurice and were janitors at Northwestern State Bank in Orange City. In later years, Otto made local deliveries for Casey's Bakery, Pluim Publishing, and Don's Food Center. Madelyne passed away on February 27, 1998, in Orange City, after more than forty years of marriage.

On June 17, 2000, Otto was united in marriage to Priscilla (Statema) De Jong in Rock Valley, and together they made their home in Orange City. On July 7, 2021, he and Priscilla moved to the Landsmeer Ridge Retirement Community in Orange City, and since March of 2022, Otto has been a resident of the Prairie Ridge Care Center.

Otto was a member of the First Christian Reformed Church in Orange City and in earlier years he served on the boards of the Orange City Christian School and New Life Treatment Center in Woodstock, Minnesota. He enjoyed going camping with his family and traveling, which included many trips to Lynden, Washington to visit his children and grandchildren.
