- Synod 2025 is scheduled for June 13-19 at Redeemer University in Ancaster, Ontario, Canada.
- The council was privileged to hear the profession of faith of Brice Kroeze. A date for public profession of faith will be scheduled.
- Church Order Article 58 was reviewed. The baptism of one who comes from another Christian denomination shall be held valid if it has been administered in the name of the triune God, by someone authorized by that denomination.
- The council discussed the recently approved Vision Statement and the importance of mentorship in the church.

The list below is for items I could use during the school year or send home for summer use.




